

Queen's representative praises CrossReach projects

The Lord High Commissioner, who is the Queen's representative at the General Assembly, has thanked staff at a CrossReach project for adults with learning disabilities for 'dedicating their lives' to helping people. In his speech at the closing session of the General Assembly, His Grace Richard Scott, Duke of Buccleuch and Queensberry said it was a 'privilege' to visit Threshold Support Services in Hamilton, South Lanarkshire. His Grace said the service supports young people with "challenging development difficulties, helping them to transition from home life to being in the community and



being with them along their whole journey through life into old age." He added he was particularly struck by staff who have dedicated their lives to "looking after those with constant needs in a loving Christian way" for at least 20 years. The Duke of Buccleugh also commended Morlich House in Edinburgh for its innovative '1950s street' which includes a working sweet shop plus a room and kitchenette decorated in the style of the 1950s. While visiting the CrossReach marquee at the Heart and Soul event in Princes Street Gardens His Grace was shown a display featuring items from the unique project and said that he thought it was an excellent idea which could help the residents remember past times in their lives.

Convener outlines recruitment challenges for CrossReach

In his speech to the General Assembly the Convener of the Social Care Council Bill Steele explained the recruitment challenges facing CrossReach: "Like many other providers of social care CrossReach is experiencing some difficulty in attracting staff and we have recognised this as an important area of focus for us as it is key to the delivery of good quality services. Recognising that there is no one answer we have been concentrating on introducing a number of different strands of activity which we hope will make a significant difference to recruitment. One of these is a new pilot partnership with The Princes Trust on a 'Get into Social Care' initiative, through which we will offer work placements and interviews to a number of young people who have already been supported by a Princes Trust employability and life skills programme and are interested in a career in care. We have also opened up new pathways into volunteering through a recently launched volunteer strategy, so that people are able to gain new experiences and test out how their own skills and talents may be suited to working in care."



"We also recognise that digital technology is increasingly important to help streamline processes, but also in offering new ways of supporting people who are using the services. A number of pilot projects are underway as part of the digital technology strategy. These include: the use of phablets to support staff who are lone working access care plans easily and support service users to update them at each visit; development of an online counselling platform which will allow people in remote and rural areas to access support as appropriate; exploration of technologies which will support a 'paper light' working environment and also reduce time spent travelling to meetings. We will be watching all of these initiatives with interest, and believe that they are important steps along the journey to sustainability."
