Come to the Kirk Hall this Sunday (10th December) at 5:30pm to support prisoners of conscience by writing simple messages on greetings cards. Cards will be supplied along with all the information you'll need. Amnesty International state that cards benefit the prisoners by telling them they are not forgotten – and by reminding their captors that the eyes of the world are watching. There will be a short introductory service and an opportunity to donate towards postage stamps, and tea or coffee will be available.
