

A message from your minister

Dear friends

This has been one of the most awful years that any of us have lived through. Some of you will have lost loved ones, and been with faced reduced numbers at their funerals with no reception afterward. Some of you will have faced loneliness and isolation. Others still will be suffering with their mental health, unable to do many of the things that previously

brought you relief.

While we sometimes associate the Christmas story with the innocence of childhood, there was nothing idyllic about that first Christmas night. Mary and Joseph had to face public shame at her being pregnant before marriage, their inability to find an appropriate place to give birth, and then shortly after Jesus' birth - a flight into Egypt to save the Christ child's life.

Yet it was into this desperate scene that God chose to born. He did this to show that he will always be with those who suffer, and worry, and struggle, and that there is no darkness too deep that he cannot enter into and transform.

One of Jesus' friends said of him that he was the 'light of the world'. 'The light shines in the darkness' he wrote 'and the darkness has not overcome it'. May you experience a little of that light this Christmas season, and find room in your life for the one who is always good, and always true, and always there.


Christmas at LYPP

The Vaccine has Landed...

...and St Michael's member Andrew Mencharowski, who works as clinical lead of outpatient theatres, made news as the first person in Scotland to receive the first dose, as he prepared to lead the vaccination programme at Edinburgh's Western General Hospital.

Speaking exclusively to St Michael's newsletter (!), Andrew said "I haven't felt any side effects myself, and the worst I've heard from anyone else so far was that their arm felt a bit heavy and slightly sore. The hard work and cooperation that's gone on to get the vaccines developed and fully tested is fantastic. We're aiming to see about 900+ people a week at the Western General alone. Regardless of which vaccine you are offered in the fight against Covid-19 I sincerely hope you will take it, as this is the best way for us all to get back to normal life."

Well done, Andrew, and we wish you and your colleagues well for the busy months ahead.
