EASTER SERVICES



One of the great joys of this time of year is to join with our friends from all the Linlithgow churches as we journey together towards the Cross and the empty tomb. Details of the joint Holy Week services are on the Easter cards distributed all around the town, and can also be found below.

It all culminates with the Open Air All-Age Easter Sunday service on Cockleroi hill at 9am on 17th April. Who knows – with Easter being so late this year, thermals may not be required! If you plan to attend this service, please be respectful of the land: leave your dogs and bicycles before you go through the gate, pick up any litter (including eggshells) and close all gates.

Then you have time for a hearty Easter breakfast before joining us in the church for Easter Sunday worship. Please note that for Sunday 17th only, this service will start at **11am**.



Linlithgow Pilgrimage






Masks Move

As of 4th April, it's no longer a legal requirement to wear a mask while you attend a church service or a funeral: it is now your personal choice whether you wish to continue wearing a mask at worship. An area at the back of the church will be clearly signposted for people to wear masks and where you can choose to sit at least 1 metre from other households.
