# **Sunday Service and Chat**

## **Back in Church!**

We're delighted that changes in the Covid-19 regulations have made it feasible to resume weekly in-person services in the church Sanctuary: and to sing together! (ok, still with masks on). Services will take place at 10am for the time being. You do still need to book a place as numbers remain limited to 70 plus leaders, stewards, musicians etc.

The best way to book is at <a href="https://stmichaelschurchservices.eventbrite.co.uk">https://stmichaelschurchservices.eventbrite.co.uk</a>. Click on 'Select a Date' and then 'Register' for the date you're interested in. After that you select how many people you are registering for - it's best to do a single booking for a household, so that we know to seat you together. You then complete contact info for everyone on the booking, and that's the job done. Eventbrite gives you the option to copy data from attendee no 1 to others in the group – but do make sure to change the name!

Alternately, you can book by leaving a message on 01506 200838. Either way, it's best to book early and certainly by 10am on the Friday before the service you hope to attend.

#### **Kirk Session News**

Here are some key points from the 'Zoom' Kirk Session meeting that took place recently:

- Session has agreed with an expert assessment that the only feasible way to refurbish
  the Crown of Thorns is by completely replacing the external cladding. Further
  discussions will now take place with Historic Environment Scotland, West Lothian
  Presbytery and the Church of Scotland General Trustees, all of whom also have to
  approve the plans. Expect to hear more soon about the fundraising for this and other
  exciting planned works.
- Session noted that the decision of this year's General Assembly to cap the number of ministry posts nationally means that St Michael's will likely take on a role supporting other congregations in our area. Further discussions will take place to define the area involved and how this might work.
- Session agreed that we should push ahead with recruiting a new Children and Young People's Worker to replace Trish Archibald. One option is that the job could be shared between 2 people, one focusing on children and families and the other on young people.
- Session also agreed that John Reid will take over the role of Session Clerk when Alan Miller comes to the end of his term of office in September. At a time of great change, when motivation and relationship building will be vital, John's passion for engaging with people will be very welcome.

#### Its Your Move

Speaking of Trish, on our behalf she has given every P7 child at Low Port and Springfield primaries a copy of 'It's Your Move', a colourful magazine-style book from Scripture Union Scotland with tips on surviving the step-up to secondary school and on how to pray when you're worried. Both schools have passed on their thanks for our chaplaincy support over the past year. Trish asks that we keep all these young people in our prayers as they go up to secondary in such difficult times.



#### **Cross House Plans**

Our architects Page\Park are working on exciting plans for the transformation of Cross House, on the theme 'A House for the Town'. They are currently in discussion with Historic Environment Scotland and with West Lothian Council planners to try to ensure that their final proposals are likely to be approved. Once the plans are finalised they'll be featured here, on the website and in Cross House itself so that as many people as possible can see them.
