


Tins of rice pudding savoury biscuits




New Fundraising Initiatives

Pray Every Day

Friday: Pray for St Michael's fundraising team as they promote the various vital church fundraising projects around the Aspire Linlithgow theme.

Saturday: Pray that our ministry team may know God's presence and enabling as they juggle the multiple pressures involved in their work of ministry and service
